National University is the second-largest private, nonprofit institution of higher learning in California.

National University consists of five schools and one college, including the Schools of Business and Management; Education; Engineering and Computing; Health and Human Services; Professional Studies; and the College of Letters and Sciences.

Founded in 1971, National University offers more than 100 undergraduate and graduate degrees and is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

Today, National University has more than 45 locations in California, Nevada, Florida, Georgia, Texas, and Virginia and has conferred over 204,000 degrees and credentials, representing a broad spectrum of ethnic, cultural, and professional groups. With a full-time equivalent student body of approximately 30,000 students from 76 countries, the University represents a true cross-section of international and American higher education.

Size and strength: National University is the second-largest private, nonprofit institution of higher learning in California.

Commitment to students: Quality, access, relevance, pace, affordability, and community are the core values that shape the National University mission and our commitment to our students.

Academic rigor: National University has surpassed nationwide benchmarks measuring the level of academic challenge at four-year colleges and universities for 10 consecutive years.

High completion rate: Approximately 90 percent of graduate international students enrolled at National University completed their degree and 85 percent of undergraduate international students complete their degree.

Alumni: Eight National University alumni have been named State Teachers of the Year, and approximately 90 alumni have been named County Teacher of the Year in California.

Great locations: Most international students study at National University's San Diego and Los Angeles locations. These cities are renowned for their Mediterranean climates, hospitality, and international flavor. Both cities boast miles of sandy beaches, sunny skies, and wonderful weather that support an amazing array of lifestyles. Surfing, diving, skiing, snowboarding, hiking, Hollywood, Disneyland, Universal Studios, Sea World, Yosemite National Park, zoos and a host of other recreational, dining, and learning experiences are all part of the incredible California culture.

Affordable degrees: National University is committed to providing affordable education. Unlike most universities, at National there is only one tuition rate for all students. That means that international students pay the same fees as an American student. National University's four-year tuition is 60 percent lower than the average four-year private university.

One-course-per-month format: National University teaches in an intensive, one-course-per-month format. This concentrated, focused approach helps international students by promoting greater interest and motivation and providing better overall learning results.

Accelerated study: Using the one-course-per-month format, our students are able to complete 12 courses per year instead of the nine-course format at other universities.

A dynamic balance of theory and practice: The University maintains high academic standards that distinguish its degree-oriented education from technical training. In developing its programs, National University places special emphasis on providing students with the technological tools and research skills students need to gain maximum benefit from their studies. Small class sizes facilitate a high level of faculty attention and involvement.

Scholarships: National University's scholarship programs support and expand its commitment to student success and diversity. Scholarships are awarded on merit, which includes academic scholarship as well as leadership.

Personalized student services: National University offers specialized one-on-one student services. The Writing Center is available to assist students at any level to develop writing and critical thinking skills. The Math Center offers help with mathematics, sciences, engineering, and business math.


Pre-arrival and arrival assistance: Students receive extensive guidance in making their preparations for travel to, and arrival in, the United States, including advice on travel, airport arrival assistance, and finding affordable housing off-campus. Homestay options are also available. Students are given a specialized orientation upon arrival.

Diverse, experienced faculty: Our faculty members are recognized for their accomplishments within academia and the workplace. More than 80 percent of the University's full-time faculty hold terminal degrees from significant institutions of higher education throughout the country. Core and adjunct faculty are part-time instructors who are top-notch professionals in the fields in which they teach. These faculty members add a practical component to our courses, providing a vital link to the "real-world" workplace.

Online library and a wide array of other resources: National University's facilities feature state-of-the-art technology. The University's library, which can be visited in person or online, offers research assistance and access to one of the largest e-book collections in the United States. All library electronic services and collections are available at any time of the day or night.

English Language Program: National University's comprehensive selection of English language programs benefit university students and professionals seeking to improve their written and verbal communication skills. These programs and the experienced and caring instructors who teach them provide support to help students gain a true and practical understanding of the English language and prepare them for academics.

International Programs Office: The dedicated staff of the International Programs Office specialize in maintenance of F-1 status, work authorization and international student advising. Qualified F-1 students are eligible to apply for 12 to 29 months of work experience called Optional Practical Training (OPT). This allows students to gain work experience in their chosen career field.





NATIONAL UNIVERSITY PROGRAM OFFERINGS

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAMS

National University is a member of the American Association of Intensive English Programs and offers an extensive selection of programs to meet the needs of students and professionals. Courses are led by skilled, experienced instructors with advanced degrees in Teachers of English Language to Speakers of Other Languages, English, linguistics and related fields. Offering more than just new language instruction, each program is designed to provide students with an exploration of contemporary American culture.

University Preparation Program

The University Preparation Program is an intensive program designed for high school graduates, university students, or professionals who plan to attend a U.S. college or university and/or want to improve their academic skills or advance in their career. Courses range from beginning through advanced levels, and cover reading, vocabulary development, grammar and writing, editing, listening, speaking, and presentation skills. Completion of this program waives English proficiency requirements (IELTS, TOEFL) for admittance into National University degree programs.

English Communication Series

The English Communication Series is intended for international students who want to improve their English communication skills while learning more about American culture. The focus of the program is on developing fluency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing through an exploration of American culture.

Academic Preparation Course Series

The Academic Preparation Course series is designed for students seeking to develop essential and advanced academic and critical thinking skills applicable in a variety of undergraduate and graduate-level programs such as health, business, accounting, engineering, computer science, and other fields.

English Camp

The English Camp is for students who want to improve their English conversation skills and learn more about American culture. This short program consists of English language classes to improve the student's conversation and writing skills mixed with various social and recreational activities emphasizing the study of American culture and lifestyle.

Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) Certificate Program

This program utilizes hands-on practice to develop the knowledge and teaching skills necessary to teach English as a Second Language at any level.



Master of Science in Engineering Management



Core topics include engineering mathematics, advanced engineering computing, digital signal processing, network systems and security, and engineering economics. Additionally, students will be able to specialize in wireless communications or computer engineering.

Master of Science in Information Technology Management

Students in this program will learn to develop the skills needed to design, build, and manage IT infrastructures, along with career skills such as project management, software development life cycle, database, cyber security, problem solving, collaboration, and critical thinking. 
Brian Simpson's research and thoughts on free market and monetary economics have been the source for books, peer-reviewed journal articles, and opinion pieces. His writings about the financial crises, energy policy and Social Security reform have appeared in numerous publications, including the San Francisco Chronicle and the Los Angeles Times. A previous Visiting Scholar at Bowling Green State University's Social Philosophy and Policy Center, Simpson lectured to doctoral students on competition, monopoly and antitrust laws. He recently secured a grant from the Charles G. Koch Foundation that funds scholarships for three economics courses at National University.




PROFESSIONAL STUDIES

The School of Professional Studies helps you to improve your community by maintaining and providing excellence and quality in research, public service, law, criminal justice-related fields, and continuing education programs. Degrees and programs available in this department include pre-law studies, criminal justice administration, domestic security management, digital cinema, digital journalism, alternative dispute resolution, and paralegal studies. The Department of Professional Studies also offers bachelor's and master's degrees in public administration.

Master of Fine Arts in Digital Cinema

This one-of-a-kind program provides an in-depth study of digital motion picture production and post-production along with a foundation in film history, theory, and screenwriting. The focus is on developing well-rounded filmmakers versed in all aspects of production and screenwriting with the ability to work on low-budget, independent, and documentary style filmmaking. STUDY IN LOS ANGELES

Known as the “City of Angels,” Los Angeles is the largest city in California and the second largest city in the U.S.

Home to more than 3.9 million people from all around the world, Los Angeles is a multicultural, metropolitan hub. Throughout the city, you can find various ethnic communities like Little Tokyo, Thai Town, China Town, Korea Town, and Little Ethiopia.

The variety of L.A.’s inhabitants is matched by the range of activities the city has to offer. Home to many working artists, writers, filmmakers, dancers, and musicians, the Los Angeles area is referred to as the “Entertainment Capital” of the world. Hollywood, only 15 miles from National University,

is home to historic L.A. sites like the old Grauman’s (now TCL) Chinese Theatre, the Hollywood Walk of Fame, and the famous “Hollywood” sign. Universal Studios, one of the oldest and most famous Hollywood studios still in use, is also a theme park where adults and children can experience movie making with attractions based on popular films. More entertainment awaits you at the city’s major sporting events. Join top Hollywood stars who come out to cheer on the world-famous Los Angeles Dodgers and Los Angeles Lakers—championship-winning teams

that feature players from around the world. There are also more than 300 museums in the Los Angeles area that can be visited year-round. The Getty Museum, for example, features art from the Middle Ages to the present and is well known for its architecture, gardens, and view of Los Angeles.

With constant sunshine and warm weather, Los Angeles’s is a great beach town. A quick bus ride from National University and students will find themselves on the shores of Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Venice Beach or Santa Monica. Open 365 days of the year and with free admission, the Santa Monica Pier has a variety of entertainment, dining and shopping outlets. In addition to all of the street performers and musicians, the pier also has a roller coaster, Ferris wheel, and an interactive aquarium.

As a student, you will not run out of things to do while studying and living in Los Angeles. A diverse city filled with opportunities and activities, Los Angeles serves as a great home to students from all around the globe.

STUDY IN SAN DIEGO

San Diego is known as “America’s Finest City”, a reputation it has earned from its year-round beautiful weather, sunny beaches, 70 miles of breathtaking Pacific Ocean coastline, and a variety of cultural activities.

San Diego is the eighth largest city in the U.S., yet retains a relaxed atmosphere. It is a center for high-tech business: electronics, telecommunications, and biotechnology. Also an active sports city, San Diego is home to the National Football League’s San Diego Chargers and Major League Baseball’s San Diego Padres. The city offers a host of activities including surfing, sailing, golf, biking, hiking, and almost anything else you can think of. It is also a center for

sports, including surfing, sailing, golf, biking, hiking, and almost anything else you can think of. And with world renowned attractions such as the San Diego Zoo, San Diego Zoo Safari Park, Legoland, Sea World, and Sea World’s new Aquatica waterpark, it is no wonder this city attracts 33 million visitors every year.

As a multicultural melting pot, San Diego is abundant in ethnic neighborhoods. Home to the most incredible beaches in Southern California, San Diego’s oceanfront communities of Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, Ocean Beach, and La Jolla represent the beauty of the California coastline. From outdoor cafés, walks in the sand, and gorgeous sunsets to fine dining, upscale boutiques, and world-class resorts, you can find many things to enjoy in these San Diego neighborhoods. Balboa Park is a must for lovers of art and history. There you can visit a variety of museums (free admission to all museums on Tuesdays) and see one of Shakespeare’s famous plays, performed by acclaimed actors, at the Old Globe Theater.

HOUSING

Living with an American family can also be an invaluable part of your learning experience in America. It is enjoyable and rewarding to both the student and the host family by learning about each other's cultures and lifestyle.

HOMESTAY ACCOMMODATIONS

Homestay accommodations are highly recommended for international students who are visiting America for the first time and are looking for the "American Experience". It is an ideal way to be immersed in both the English language and American Culture. Students living in an English speaking homestay are more likely to improve and retain their English language skills as they have more opportunities to interact and practice English with their American host family.

Key features of homestay:

- Student has their own room (unless a shared room is requested) with bed, bedding, wardrobe, desk and desk lamp
- Two meals per day – weekdays, and three meals on the weekend
- Bathrooms (private or shared)
- Laundry facilities
- Access to a telephone (a phone card is needed)
- Security and safety
- Fees: approximately U.S. \$900 per month

ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate Admission: Successful completion of year 12 or equivalent with a minimum GPA of 2.0. ACT/SAT recommended.

Graduate Admission: Four-year bachelor's degree or equivalent with a minimum GPA of 2.5, or completion of National University's Foreign Credential Bridge Program.

Proof of English proficiency, which may be met by one of the following:

- a. Achieving a TOEFL score of
 - i. Undergraduates: 70 (IBT)
 - ii. Graduates: 79 (IBT)
- b. Achieving an IELTS score of at least
 - i. Undergraduates: 5.5, with no band lower than a 5
 - ii. Graduates: 6, with no band lower than a 5
- c. DAAD
 - i. Undergraduate: All from Level A or all from Level B, or a combination of Level A and B only
 - ii. Graduate: All from Level A or all from Level B, or a combination of Level A and B only
- d. Certificate of Proficiency in English with a C grade or higher
- e. Certificate of Advanced English with a C grade or higher
- f. Completion of an approved intensive English language program

Monthly application deadline:

Four months prior to desired start date is suggested.
